

## H1N1 Flu (Swine Influenza) Resources (5/09) **UPDATE** (11/09)

In late March and early April 2009, cases of human infection with swine influenza A (H1N1) viruses were first reported in Southern California and near San Antonio, Texas. Other U.S. states have reported cases of H1N1 flu (swine influenza) infection in humans and cases have been reported internationally as well. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is providing up-to-date information on the recent outbreak of H1N1 flu in humans including information for health-care professionals. Because this is an evolving situation, interested individuals should check the CDC Web site frequently for the latest information.
