


## New Dental Materials

Centrix recently introduced **FluoroDose**; a clear, hard-setting, 5% sodium-fluoride varnish in the LolliPack unit-dose delivery system. FluoroDose is advertised to dry within seconds after saliva contact, forming an ultra-thin and clear material that remains in place for up to eight hours. FluoroDose is said to consist of 22,600 ppm sodium fluoride contained within natural-based resins. The Bubble Gum and Mint flavors are marketed as being based on natural sweeteners. Each LolliPack is listed as containing 0.3 mL of FluoroDose and one Benda Brush applicator.

**KALORE** is GC America's newest restorative composite resin that is said to be based on a new, proprietary DX-511 monomer, diurethane methacrylate, and dimethacrylate co-monomers. The DX-511 monomer technology from DuPont is described as adding a long, rigid-core, high-molecular-weight monomer that results in a reduction in polymerization shrinkage. KALORE is advertised as being compatible with all currently-marketed adhesives and curing lights. KALORE's fillers are said to provide good radiopacity as well as increased wear resistance due to a new filler surface treatment that enhances the bond between the fillers and resin matrix. The fillers are advertised to consist of a unique blend of fluoroaluminosilicate and Barium/Strontium glasses along with silicon dioxide nanofillers whose combination is said to refract light similar to tooth structure. Hence, GC America states that KALORE possesses a "chameleon" effect that provides excellent shade matching to the point that fewer shade varieties of KALORE will be required to meet clinical needs. KALORE is available in 15 shades as well as 5 opaque and 6 translucency shades, but is not presently available in the usually-marketed, all-encompassing multi-shade package. Instead, clinicians can order the most-used shades individually in either 10- or 20-count packages. A 10-count package is available for \$51.00 (suggested retail) and \$30.20 (government) and a 20-count package lists at \$102.00 (suggested retail) and \$60.40 (government). KALORE is also available in a syringe delivery system and pricing is available from the manufacturer.
